




1. Why did you or your group want to participate in a Building Bridge Presentation from the Hmong Cultural Center?

N=86, some respondents answered to more than one answer.


Some participants noted that it was for class requirement, and to better serve Hmong Students in the school.

2. Please pick the category that the best describes your profession (Please choose one category only).




A few of the participants noted that they are Chemical Dependency Counselors.

3. How would you rate your satisfaction with the presentation that was provided in terms of educational value? (Please choose one answer only)




4. Please provide below specific examples of Building Bridges program content that you found particularly helpful (i.e. subject topics covered)




A participant noted that he had hard time understanding the presenter so the handout was helpful.


