play the Qeej instrument in Hmong funeral ceremonies, and instructed a similar number of community members in the oral recitation of traditional Hmong funeral and wedding songs; and

Since 1999, the Hmong Cultural Center of Minnesota has provided the community with the

Hmong Resource Center Library, which is a unique collection of books, dissertations, and journal and newspaper articles recognized as the largest centralized collection of Hmong-related scholarly

research in the United States; and

The Hmong Cultural Center is a key resource for providing multicultural education in our community through important initiatives including the Hmong 101 speakers bureau and online

Celebrating its Twenty-Fifth Anniversary, the Hmong Cultural Center of Minnesota continues to

promote multicultural education in our communities with new initiatives, outreach projects, and

educational programs.
